We expect all submissions to be pieced by you, or by a group of which you are a member, with the only exception being the Heirloom/Antique category. Winners will receive a hand crafted ribbon and will be recognized during the Show.

19. Open Category

- 1. Patriot** – Includes patriotic themed quilts and hero quilts (historical, military, police, fire department, etc.).
- 2. Hand Quilted** – May be quilted by someone else, but it must be pieced by you.
- 3. Machine Quilted** – Focuses on the quilting (on any type of machine) rather than the piecing of the quilt; includes specialty quilting techniques.
- 4. Free Motion Quilting** – Any quilt that you quilted that was not done by a computerized quilting machine. This can be either your own design or from a pattern as long as you controlled the machine.
- 5 Applique** – Includes hand applique and machine applique quilts.
- 6. Embroidery** – Using threads to form decorative designs with hand or machine needlework.
- 7. Solo Creation** – The quilter pieced, quilted, and bound the quilt without help from others.
- 8. Group Project** – A group of 2 or more people pieced this quilt. Please specify group if it has a name or the names of individuals.

9. Small Project – Includes wall hangings, table runners, tote bags, clothing, and other non-lap-size quilt entries.

10. Youth Quilter – Is someone 17 years of age or younger. All entries in this category will be judged together regardless of item.

11. Senior Quilter – Is someone who is at least 65 years of age making any type of quilt. The senior may merely piece the quilt and have it quilted by another or may be a solo creator.

12. Novice Quilter – Is someone who has between 1 and 4 years of quilting experience. This category includes any type/size of quilt.

13. Professional Quilter – Is someone who designs quilt patterns, teaches quilting classes, sells patterns for profit, quilts other quilter's quilts, etc.

14. Heirloom/Antique – This category is used for quilts that were not created by you...i.e. someone else created the quilt.

15. Panel - Any quilt that uses a preprinted fabric picture with blocks or borders in the design to make a quilt.

16. Holiday - Any quilt that uses Holiday (any holiday Easter, 4th July, Halloween, Christmas, etc) fabric to make a holiday themed quilt.

17. Flowers/Garden - Any quilt that uses fabric or is theme to be something in the garden or flowers.

18. Modern Quilt - Modern Quilts are primarily functional and inspired by modern design. Modern quilters work in different styles and define modern quilting in different ways, but several characteristics often appear which may help identify a Modern Quilt. These include, but are not limited to: use of bold colors and prints, high contrast and graphic areas of solid colors, improvisational piecing, minimalism, expansive negative space, and alternate grid of work. Modern Traditionalism or the updating of classic quilt designs is also often seen in modern quilting."

19. Open Category - Any quilt that does not fit in any other category

Preparing your quilt for entry: All entries should have a **fabric label** attached to the bottom left hand corner of the back of the item. The label should contain: (1) name of quilt and (2) name of quilt maker. The quilt should have a **hanging sleeve** that has either been stitched or safety pinned (no straight pins, please) to the top edge of the back of the quilt. (Note: if your quilt is longer than 82", please place the hanging sleeve at 82" or pin up the bottom of your quilt so that it can be hung at 82" and not touch the floor.)

A **copy of your entry form** should be attached to the quilt's **protective case**. **This application will need to be filled out online, www.tomballmuseumcenter.com**. We encourage you to place your quilted item in a cloth bag, such as a pillowcase, so that it may be protected before the show and returned to you in that bag after the show.

Although every precaution will be taken to protect your entry, we cannot be responsible for damage or loss.

Submitting your Quilt to the Show: Quilt Show items should be **brought to the Chapel at the Tomball Museum the day of the show no later than 9:00am**

Quilts will be hung that morning and must hang throughout the show on Saturday, June 8th

Picking Up your Quilt: You may pick up your quilts after the winner of the Blue Ribbon is announced. >>>Pick up no later than 3pm.

If you cannot personally pick up your quilt during the times listed, you will be asked to identify an alternate who will pick up your quilt on Sunday. Please be prepared to identify your alternate when you drop off your quilt on Thursday. Your alternate must provide identification on Sunday so that we are sure we are returning your quilt to the correct individual.
